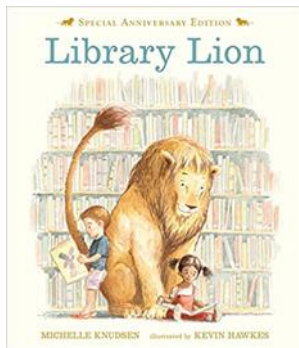
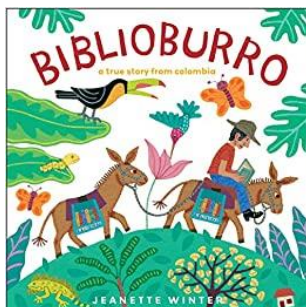


Library Reads for Canadian Library Month, 2021



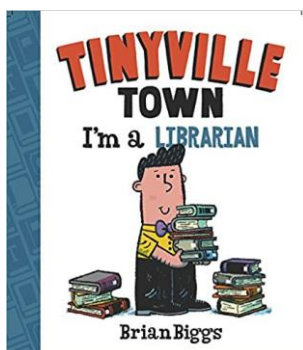
1. Library Lion (written by Michelle Knudsen and illustrated by Kevin Hawkes) (Ages: 4 – 8 years)

Library Lion is a charming story and exquisitely illustrated book. A lion makes his way into a library, one day, and is loved by all – or almost all! There are no rules about lions in the library, and the lion proves to have found his place there. Until something happens and he leaves, only to return when it is realized how irreplaceable he really was. Library Lion will please many while showing children that the library is a welcoming place for all to learn. It is an enriching read.



2. Biblioburro: A True Story from Colombia (written and illustrated by Jeanette Winter) (Ages: 6 – 9 years)

In Biblioburro, Jeanette Winter recounts the true story of Luis Soriano, an avid reader in Colombia who found an intriguing way to share his love of books and stories with children and adults. Luis, with his two donkeys named Alfa and Beto, travels across long distances to isolated villages to share his own books with those who do not have easy access to books. The innocent illustrations complement the simple text in telling the tale Luis's generous and creative idea of a travelling library that can inspire many lovers of books of any age.



3. I'm a Librarian (A Tinyville Town Book) (written and illustrated by Brian Biggs) (Ages: 0 – 3 years)

Part of the Tinyville Town preschool series about professions, I'm a Librarian introduces infants to the daily routine of Kevin the librarian. Kevin knows a lot about many things and loves helping people get the information they are looking for. But when he discovers that the books about elephants that a boy is looking for have gone missing, he searches throughout the library to find them.
