


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## Book of the month: Ruby's Chinese New Year by Vickie Lee (4-8 years old)

## Introducing the book:



### Exploring the Cover:

Look at the cover. Ask children to name the animals they see. Explain to them that the objects they see hanging are Chinese lanterns, and they are a symbol of celebration for Chinese New Year.

### **Building Background:**

Ask children if they celebrate the Chinese New Year, also called the Lunar New Year. Explain to children the difference between the solar calendar and the lunar calendar. Make a list of the animals the children think will appear in the book. Explain to them this year is the Year of the tiger.

## Reading the book:

- -As you read the book, compare the animals listed by the children to the ones shown in the book. They all reveal a tradition, a type of food or a tradition related to this celebration.
- Make a list of those items, such as fish, dumplings, rice cake, lanterns, ribbons, cards, etc. and make a list of those items to be displayed in the class.
- At the end of the story, the author explains why those animals were chosen to be in the Chinese Zodiac and what they represent. Ask children to name their favourite animals.

# After reading the book:

## Paper lanterns:

- -Print a paper lantern template (link above).
- -Cut some red paper into squares.
- -Provide some crayons, tape/glue and let children decorate the lantern.
- -Cut out the lantern template after decorating
- -Attach a yellow square paper at the bottom (Taped it at the back) and let children cut it to make vertical stripes.
- -Attach a strip of yellow paper at the top to make the handle.

#### Chinese Zodiac Stick Puppets:

Children can use these when rereading the book!

-Download a set of Chinese Zodiac animal clinart /

- -Download a set of Chinese Zodiac animal clipart (link below)
- -Children cut and colour them.
- -Stick them on popsicle sticks.

### Making drawings for good luck:

Ask children to draw on a piece of paper nice things they wish for the Chinese New Year and display them on a poster or the classroom wall.
