




Perfectly Polite Penguins, Not, by Georgiana

Age 3-7



Age 1-4


When curious Penguin finds a lost pinecone in the snow, their friendship grows into something extraordinary!

Tacky the Penguin is a delightful tale about being true to yourself — even when it means being a little different from everybody else.




And Tango Makes Three, by Justin Richardson and Peter Parnell



Age 0-3



Penguins Are Awesome, by Jaclyn Jaycox

Age 6-10

Penguins waddle slowly across the ice. But in the frigid waters they zoom after prey. Learn how these birds stay warm in their polar habitat, how they raise their young, and how they find food while avoiding predators.



Where Are You Penguin?, by Rachael Hare

Age 0-3
