# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Fraser-Hickson Institute continued to evolve and thrive in 2022. I'm delighted to share that as we closed out the year, our flagship **minibiblioPLUS** project served 161 partner locations and 280 programs.

We could not do this work without strong community support. The Fraser-Hickson Institute is blessed with a dynamic team of staff and volunteers, community partners, donors, literacy champions at all levels of government, and our Governing Board and Honorary Board members.



In February 2022, we welcomed David Andrelli to the position of Interim Executive Director while Executive Director Asha Dixit is on maternity leave until March 2023. David has navigated the role with aplomb. The Fraser-Hickson Institute has benefitted from his leadership, his enthusiasm for early childhood literacy and community development, and his operational know-how.

The Fraser-Hickson Institute is overseen by an esteemed Board of Governors who volunteer their time to drive the mission and vision of our library. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Kate Shingler who stepped down from the Board in 2022 after years of dedicated service, and to welcome our newest Governor, Tara Roberts, to the fold.

Learning to read is the first step in reading to learn. The Fraser-Hickson Institute was founded in 1885 as a privately funded, free public library with a mission to promote literacy and facilitate access to knowledge through books. Times and modes of operation may have changed, but our library has never wavered from its commitment to raising literacy levels and instilling in children a life-long love of reading and learning by providing free access to books and animation services, with an emphasis on encouraging parents and caregivers to read to children during their first 1000 days of life.

This is powerful stuff. The resilience of the Fraser-Hickson, a longstanding institution still going strong after 137 years, speaks to the grit of a community committed to building a better future for our children. Together, we are nurturing future-facing generations that will, in their turn, contribute to building a healthier, more prosperous Montreal, Quebec, and Canada.

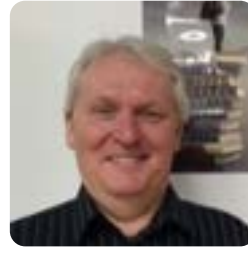

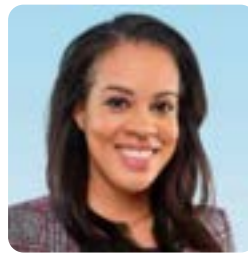

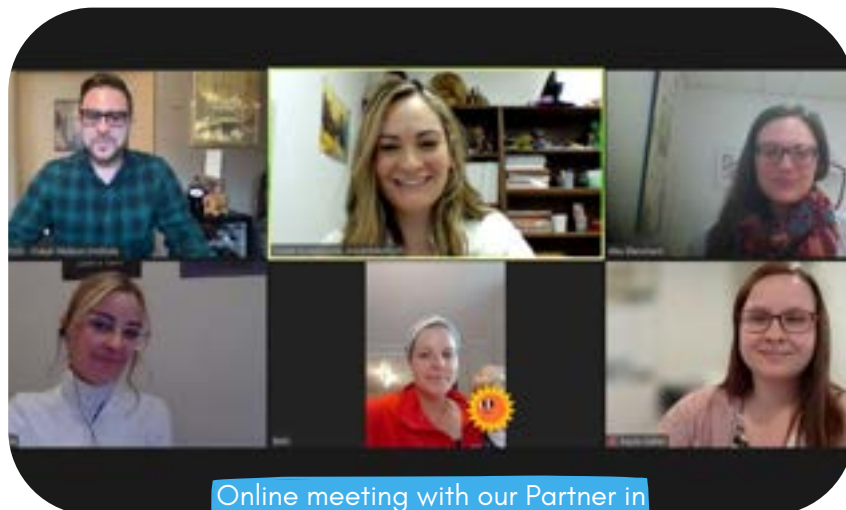

# TREASURER'S REPORT

We continue our efforts to reach as many children as possible with the resources available. This year, we benefitted from an increase in total revenues of almost 22 %, resulting in most part by an increase in donations.

Even with a small increase in human resource costs, and a significant increase in book purchases, we ended with an operational surplus. However, our investment performance resulted in an overall loss for the year.

We have welcomed new donors and continue to benefit from our faithful multiyear donors.

We are also delighted to benefit from a continued and most welcome cooperation with the City of Montréal.

As well, we look forward to a very bright future in 2023 and beyond.
